Her quilting ranged from family gifts, donation pieces, contest quilts, challenge pieces and having a couple of quilts published.

Lou joined BTQG in the 1980's and was active in the evening group for many years. She and her husband, Tom, now live in Columbia and their two sons and families reside in Kansas City.

She is very excited to be back again and hope you enjoy the presentation of her heritage quilts and those that she has constructed in her years of quilting.



tion. Unless the group is noted as 'closed' any guild member will be welcome to attend. Some groups may be organized for a specific time and with limited number of people... like the "Jane Austen" or "Civil War block exchange". Go and try out a group... you'll like it.

As a courtesy you might call the contact member to verify information and to let them know to expect you.

I heartily recommend the interest groups... every one should belong to at least one. Just call me and we can get the ball rolling.
