I learned to sew with my mother on her treadle Singer sewing machine. She taught me to make skirts and blouses from the feed sacks that the cattle's food came in!!! With her help, I made my first quilt top while in high school. Being totally ignorant of correct seams, bias edges, etc., I chose the "Lone Star" pattern. This was many years before rotary cutters and rulers. I still remember the hours it took to cut out all those diamonds!! We got the pattern from the Kansas City Star and I still have the quilt.


