

Thirteen ladies gathered together to discuss the idea of some type of club or guild based around their love of quilting and the opportunity to share their experiences with each other. The year was 1978 and today 35 years later the guild's membership averages 200 women and the ladies are still sharing their love of quilting.

Scrap books, photo albums and stored memories surround the two meetings held monthly. Three of the original members remember their days of gathering their children and all their quilting supplies together to head to an afternoon to share new skills, learn new techniques and boast about their current quilt project that was finished last night at 2:00 am while the rest of the family slept. In those days a baby sitter was provided.

Today that same exploration of new techniques and enthusiasm abounds with the members. The two chapters meet monthly with 8 special interests groups gathering at someone's home or the library to continue to expand their knowledge on a particular aspect of quilting and update their friends on the latest goings on in their lives.

Over the years the guild has held a national quilt symposium, a regional conference, provided quilts for Rainbow House, and the biennial quilt show that provides a showcase for their beautifully finished quilts.

Every gathering of the members is filled with affection and cheerful astonishment for a quilting project created, completed and passed on to a loved one, dear friend or someone in need!!

Starlight Chapter Exchange Block Winner—Donna Baker

I missed the Starlight meeting last January and what a nice surprise to hear that I had won. I've been a member since 1996 when we moved here from San Diego, and have really enjoyed getting to know so many wonderful gals and learning so much about patterns, workshops,

quilting and getting involved in different groups.

My big problem is that I want to do it all and have too many ongoing projects. I also love to garden and have way too many flower plots, which only means I have that many more weeds to hoe! I've been quilting since 1976 and have never gotten bored with it.

I've been lucky to win the drawing several times and have enjoyed planning and making quilts from your blocks. I've settled on an easy block for a baby quilt that I'll give to the church to pass onto a new baby when it's born. Thanks for you help in making this quilt.

Day Chapter Exchange Block Winner Sharon Lawler

I, Sharon Lawler, was drawn as the January Day Chapter Exchange Block Winner. Although I have been sewing since high school, I have only been quilting since 2003. My mother pieced quilts and then hand quilted them on homemade frames set in the living room during the bulk of each winter for as long as I can remember. My first quilt was a log cabin. I didn't know how much fabric to buy, and I didn't even know that I could find quilt patterns in books and magazines, so I took a yard each of seven coordinating fabrics to my mom and asked her to show me how to make a log cabin quilt. Before I finished that quilt top, I joined this quilt guild. I made many service project quilt tops so I could get the hang of planning and cutting and sewing quilt tops without cutting into my own fabric and chance ruining it. Doing service projects and doing exchange blocks for others was a great way for me to gain confidence. Joining a new members' interest group was a great way for me to gain skills in several styles of quilt making and develop a core group of friends within the guild. In the last few years, I have followed in my mother's footsteps and started a machine quilting business. Mom began a quilting business in 1970 and retired from it in just the last few years.

I grew up on a farm near ElDorado Springs, Missouri. I attended Central Missouri State University in Warrensburg, getting a double major in vocational home economics and child development. I taught home economics in Windsor and Calhoun before branching into guidance and counseling. After getting my masters and education specialist degrees in guidance and counseling from Central Missouri State, my husband and I moved to Clifton Hill where I was guidance counselor in the middle school for the Westran School District. Later, I worked for one year at the University of Missouri in a teacher resource state agency (Missouri Linc) and then used my counseling skills for twelve years at Moberly High School where I met Jackie Berry who was at that time (and still is) a member of BTQG. I saw some of the beautiful quilts that she made. I finished my career as early childhood psychological examiner with Columbia Public Schools and retired this last spring.

In keeping with the February theme of celebrating BTQG's founding anniversary, the block that I am asking members to make is the Boonslick Star. I will provide the pattern and fabrics to make one block and ask that you also make a second block in your choice of colors. This will be a tough project, but you can practice making it with my fabrics before you try it with your own fabrics.
