Jean Warren—June 3rd Speaker

Jean Warren, historic fabric expert and owner of James Country Mercantile of Liberty, Missouri, will present "Historic Quilts of the 19th Century". A mix of original quilt tops, original quilt blocks, and photographs of period quilts will be included in her presentation from the 1840 through 1900. Jean is also a **sutler.** A sutler is a civilian merchant who sells provisions to an army in the field, in camp or in quarters from the James Country Mercantile.
