An Unexpected Delight with Design Candy Hargrove

After becoming addicted to counted cross stitch in the early 1980's, Candy took her first quilting class in the late 80's. However, like many of us her quilt making was put on hold until 1998.

Candy avoided the intricacies of appliqué because it just look like something she didn't want to do it. A very talented hand appliqué teacher inspired her to try her hand at it. Now hand appliqué is one of her favorite techniques.

Candy retired from her human resources job at General Motors at the beginning of 2007 with the intention of making all the quilts she had wanted to make for a long time but didn't have the time. It seemed like a great idea but a request from a friend was to alter her quilting life.

Julie Kiffin, Candy's good friend, hooked her up with Jo Morton who was seeking someone to design and make Jo's free-to-use patterns for Andover Fabrics. Since her retirement she has designed and made over 20 quilts for the Andover website beginning with Jo's Lucinda lines. Jo also published two of Candy's designs in her book "Vintage Journey".

In 2008, Candy accomplished a quilting goal she had set for herself when one of her quilts (not her design) was accepted at Paducah. Never one without a goal, she is combining her talents to have one of her own designs accepted at an AQS show.

Kansas City, Missouri is Candy' home along with her two rescue dogs: Buster, a Bichon mix and Bonnie, a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel.

August Starlight Exchange Winner—Judi Kirkpatrick

I have chosen to do a 4 patch in which 2 of the patches are made out of strips. It will use 5" squares in fall colors (not Halloween) and a fabric that I will provide. In looking through my quilt items I discovered that I didn't have much for my home for fall. This seems like a good way to start.

My twin granddaughters (turning 14) next month, have expressed a desire to learn to quilt. My birthday present for them is going to be a trip to the fabric store where they can pick out fabric and I will give them quilting lessons for their first quilt. I can hardly wait...what an honor to pass on this tradition. I have 3 sons and while they appreciated the quilts they had no interest in learning. I can still hear them when wondering what was for supper telling each other, "Oh well, Mom's quilting, we'll probably have Judi surprise." That meant I was just going to throw something together from the fridge or cupboard. Despite the lack of a truly balanced meal sometimes, the boys grew up to be understanding sons especially when they or one of their family members received a quilt made with love.







Cheap Tricks with Bettina Havig

Bettina had one table filled with gadgets and other cheap stuff you might find around your house to make your quilting not only easier but less expensive. Her secret funny quilted companions make her hours quilting a lot of fun. Judi is assisting Bettina with a small ironing board on which 2 straight pins have been place about 8 inches a part. Using a strip of fabric for decorative appliqué, you can pull the strip of fabric through the pins ironing it as it slides through to make a perfect folded bias or straight strip for immediate use. Bettina has gone Hollywood using a favorite tool to assist with determining the value/intensity of the selected colors/prints of fabric. It is a red film often used by artists to ascertain if their colors used in the paintings have the same value/intensity. That is, one fabric doesn't out shine or overtake another color. You can find the film at a local hobby shop.


Yorktown Strippy Sampler By Candy Hargrove
