#### "AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR CEO"

At the Board meeting on December 9, the Board accepted a 6-foot ladder donated by Virginia Peterson, our Historian. The Board also accepted a cash donation from Christi Brietzke, our Hospitality Chairperson, for shelving that will be anchored above and beside the library cabinets. Both the shelves and the taller ladder will add a bit more safety for our ladies as they reach for Hospitality and Membership supplies above the cabinets. Many thanks are extended to these fine ladies for their thoughtful donations.

Service Project plans for January's Starlight Chapter and for February's Day Chapter sound great. Be sure to come to these chapter meetings and bring basic hand sewing supplies or your sewing machine and basic supplies. Projects in various stages need completion, and new quilt tops need to be planned and sewn. The Service Project team will provide fabrics, some 2 ½ inch pre-cut strips, and a variety of patterns; but feel free to bring a quick and easy pattern of your own. True North, Rainbow House, and Ronald McDonald House have received quilts this year. At the preference of the Service Project committee, other 501-C organizations might be added, and suggested projects could include other quilted items in addition to quilts. Keep listening for details later.

We have lost some former guild members this year. BTQG Policy designates that a book is purchased with guild funds and donated to a public library in memory of a current member who dies, but this does not include former members who left the guild in recent years because of health or other circumstances. However, these former members are still dear to the hearts of many of us. Therefore, the Board decided to try a donation system to pay for books to be given to a public library in memory of members from recent years. Corinne Remeika volunteered to collect donations for a book in memory of Connie Rice and another book in memory of Lois Harriman, with both books to be donated to DBRL. If you wish to donate or to suggest a certain book, contact Corinne by early January. The Board felt that, in the future, someone who was especially close to a recent member who has passed on might wish to serve as the collector of donations for that deceased quilter, buy a book, and take it to the public library as a donation in memory of that quilting friend. On occasions when more money is collected than the actual cost of the selected book, the surplus money would be added to our BTQG library budget. If you have suggestions that would help to develop this idea more fully, please let me know.

The Board of Directors voted to not hold a Board business meeting in January. We will resume again on February 10 at 6:30 p.m. in Conference Room A at DBRL. We'll hope to see you at the January chapter meetings on January 2 and January 6.


mat because of that whole wavy thing they like to do, so I hope this will help.


