Eternal Triangles Workshop

A scrap quilt class by Bettina Havig Friday, September 13, 2013 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Cost of workshop \$20.00

Explore the endless options of quilts made essentially from right angle triangles. By participating in an optional exchange of fabrics to expand you scrap collection even quilters with a small stash can make a quilt with up to two hundred fabrics. Cutting and piecing are simple and the design options are both exciting and mesmerizing. Students will receive three patterns for table runners using the blocks they make in class.

This workshop is limited to 20 participants.
