"AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR CEO"

If you were at an April chapter meeting, then you had an opportunity to see BTQG's new shelves. Your Board planned this improvement last fall, waited for written approval from the church's Board of Directors, and installed the shelves in March. My husband was persuaded to design and build them. Merril, Virginia, Hank and Hank's husband Jack met Larry and me at the church to install them and organize the totes. Cost of the shelving was \$140.38 plus the 16 hours of labor by Larry and me. Cost to the guild? Nothing. My husband and I donated the labor and some hardware. Donations were made by Christi Brietzke and Alice Leeper to cover the cost of plywood and other hardware. Linda Karns and I donated rolling plant stands to assist with easy storage for the speakers. Virginia Peterson donated a 6-foot ladder to add even more safety in reaching and storing totes. Ustena Simenson donated some better sealing totes and tote labels. Good ideas and team work can accomplish much.

The photo directory is another example of a good idea put into action. This idea was presented to the Board last fall. A committee of Mary Petersen, Karon Huggler and Laura Eggeman spent several months getting photos of willing guild members for a prototype of this project. This directory looks great. If you do not have yours, then be sure to pick one up from the membership table during May's chapter meetings. Pictures of willing members are to be included in the 2014-2015 Membership Directory and Handbook next fall. This project adds only three sheets of paper to the printing cost of each booklet but adds a helpful aspect in knowing fellow guild members a bit more.

The Board made some changes in the Policies of BTQG. If changes had been suggested that the Board felt to be controversial, we would have consulted you, the membership. As it is, however, most of the changes to the Policies were ones that simplify some confusing language and that correct some grammar and punctuation. This committee was chaired by Ustena Simenson who served very capably in this role. She is in a leadership position within her professional career and has experience with organizations through that avenue. Other capable members of this committee were Donna Baker, Willie Morris, Merril Winfield, Marilyn Wooldridge, and Sharon Lawler. The guild web site has the new set of Policies. Look elsewhere in this newsletter for the new wording in the areas that the Board changed.

The Board thanks all of you who through words and actions this year have been supportive of us. The Board's goal is always to make BTQG a more enjoyable, meaningful experience for you.

POLICIES OF BOONESLICK TRAIL QUILTERS' GUILD

April 2014: Additions in italics: (deletions are underlined and in parenthesis)

1 Annual Meeting, 2 Elected Officers, 3 Guild Properties and Equipment [no changes]

4 Library [a through c, no changes]

d A book shall be purchased in memory of any *current* BTQG member who passes away, and the book shall be donated to (the) a public library in that person's name. The book is purchased from contingency funds.

e Former members can have a book given in their name to a public library with funds donated by individual guild members. Any guild friend of the deceased former member can ask to select a book and collect the needed donations. Excess money collected above the price of the book will be donated to the guild library.

5 Membership [a through d, no changes]

(e Only Membership Handbooks and Directories that have not been picked up by October 15th and have out-of-state addresses will be eligible for mailing. Booklets that are not eligible for mailing will be available from the Membership Committee.)

e A Membership Directory and Handbook not picked up by October 15 will be mailed to out-of-state members. In-state members must get their copy from the Membership table during chapter meetings.

f A NEW member is a person who has never been a member of BTQG previously. [no changes to f] g. Members wishing to receive an extra Membership Directory and Handbook may purchase one at \$2.00 each. Officers and chairpersons may receive a second copy if desired.

6 Publications [a, c, d, and e, no changes]

b. BTQG will not use bulk mailing for the newsletter, **due to inconsistent delivery schedules and item count restrictions.**

f. The Membership Directory and Handbook shall include member information, by-laws, policies, procedures, and chapter programs for the coming year. The Membership Directory and Handbook is for the personal use of members only, not for commercial use.

7 Quilt Show [no changes]

8 Retreats [a, no changes]

b The policy for BTQG retreats is as follows:

i Registration for the retreat shall follow workshop registration policies. The Retreat Committee will maintain a waiting list of interested (persons) **Guild members** and attempt to fill vacancies from the waiting list. [ii and iii, no changes]

9 Special Workshops and Speakers [a through v, no changes]

vi Supply lists for workshops will be published at the same time as workshop information and registration forms, allowing enrollees to know costs involved in addition to the registration fee as part of their decision to enroll in the class or workshop.

10 Treasurer, 11 Budget, 12 Voting Procedure [no changes]

13 COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES [add number 13 in front of "Committee Responsibilities"]

A description of duties of each elected officer is in the By Laws. For continuity between years, it is essential that a detailed description of officer and of committee responsibilities be passed on to successors. Therefore, in May, the elected officers and committee chairpersons shall submit to the CEO an updated detailed written description of how their office or committee functions. By July, each committee chairperson and officer shall also give (this) said written description to their successor, along with any materials or forms related to that office or committee. The CEO shall submit this update of each office and committee description to the webmaster for publication on the web site.

Chapter Program Chairpersons: (<u>Each Chapter Program Chairperson</u>) <u>Each chapter shall have a Chapter Program Chairperson who</u> shall be responsible for and prepare a calendar of programs for the membership directory. <u>(The)</u> <u>These</u> chairpersons shall contact and make a written contract with speakers for chapter meetings

and events. The chairpersons shall work with the hospitality chairperson on special hospitality events, such as chapter meetings with special guest speakers. The chairperson shall work in conjunction with the chapter president to build a volunteer system of members for needs of specific chapter meetings, such as helping with set up of equipment and room and holding quilts for viewing **and to secure a guild member or two to act as a hostess for the guest speaker.**

Quilt Show, Library, Special Programs, Historian [no changes]

Service Project: The Chairperson shall coordinate all materials for construction of service projects and orchestrate the work sessions and shall see to the delivery of completed items and shall maintain contact with the current chosen (<u>recipient</u>) <u>organizations</u>. All <u>recipients</u> of quilts must be 501(c)(3) <u>organizations</u>.
