

A special sewing session for the Marketplace will be the program for the August 14th Starlight Chapter of the Guild. Our committee will have kits available for members to sign out and work on during the meeting. The following kits will be available: portfolios for kindles and Ipads, mug rugs, flannel baby blankets, snap closure bags of several sizes, nine-patch pillow covers for 14" pillow forms. These kits will have fabric already cut out and materials needed. **PLAN TO BRING:** sewing machine, gray and off-white thread, bobbins, basic sewing kit, 12-18" ruler, extension cord, press board and small iron if you have one (we'll plan to have one or more ironing stations as well). *Come and have fun.*

There are also several kits for wall-hangings donated by Nancy Kennedy which a member or several members may sign out to work up for the Marketplace. You are also welcome to come with a project you are already working on for it and to enjoy visiting with friends while you work. We hope as many of you as can will come and help.

Thank you to those who have already been so generous with fabrics and with your time and careful attention in making lovely items that you have turned in. We are sorting and counting those items by category. So, please turn in completed items as soon as possible, so we can gauge when we have enough of any item and when to request more of them. If you have a minimum price that you want your item to sell for, please let us know, so we can record that and mark your item accordingly. Also, if your item is offered on consignment, be sure to pin or stick on a tag to indicate that and tell me.

We can also use more aprons, table-runners and table toppers, mug rugs and donation of mugs to go with them, embroidered or appliquéd tea towels, place-mats and napkins sets.

We have decided to have a section of very gently used items: cookbooks, quilting books & magazines, antique linens, knitted items, books for children and adult novels (especially quilter mysteries and stories), knick-knacks, and decorative items are some suggestions. If you are unsure, feel free to check with our committee members as to whether we can include certain items.

The Bonne Femme BQTG Book Group Adventure




We took a delightful 3-day trip to the Quilt Capital of Iowa: Kalona and also visited the Amanas, home to a number of quilt shops, country general stores, Amish furniture stores, a cheese factory, a chocolate shop, a well-known carved and inlaid wood craftsman at J&K Wood, and the usual good food found in that part of the country. Three cars transported us to a very large Amish Dutchman Store that provides staples in hugh quantities for the people of the area. The weather was perfect!



The first night we enjoyed a delicious dinner at a Mennonite home located on a large farm just west of Kalona. The meal consisted of fried chicken, tender roast beef, mashed potatoes, green beans, green salad, noodles, home made bread and pie. Bettina Havig arranged the three-day adventure which included a wonderful opportunity to meet Sara Miller, an Amish quilter exordinaire. Bettina has known Sara for over 25 years meeting ever since when Sara invited Bettina to give a presentation on Amish quilts.



The ladies purchased fabric, patterns, notions, kitchen tools, hand-crafted wood items, a quilt block from an antique store, t-shirts from the Kalona Quilt and Textile Museum, scrumptious chocolate candies, ice cream sundaes, cheeses, and thoroughly enjoyed the welcoming atmosphere at each place we visited. A few even found some unusual snack items. A few from the group were first time visitors to Iowa and saw spectacular landscapes filled with farm animals, corn over 9 feet tall, soy beans, and gardens filled with vegetables and bright flowers. Each farm was very well attended with lovely large grass lawns, simple well-maintained homes, and horses and buggies. One group stopped by a goat farm with over 30 animals and the goats ventured right up to the fence with large expressive eyes curious about this car filled with ladies who wanted to take their picture.

Modern Quilt from the St. Louis Modern Quilt Guild



Monique Dillard gained a love for quilting while growing up around relatives in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. Monique lives in Rockford, Illinois, where she taught at a local quilt shop while her national audience grew. She has been featured in several quilting magazines and has published several quilting good and over 76 quilt patterns. She has designed six rulers that have a national reputation for adding accuracy in size to flying geese and other specialty piecing techniques.

Booneslick Trail Quilters' Guild members and guests have an opportunity to learn from Monique Dillard on Thursday, September 25, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. while she shows 50 quilts and describes the techniques used to create each. The no-cost lecture will be in the lower community room of Masonic Lodge at 6033 North Masonic Drive, a few miles north of Columbia on Highway 63 (see map).

Thursday night's lecture is free of charge to guild members and guests. Friday's 8:30 until 3:30 class fee is \$35.00 for BTQG members and \$45.00 for all others who wish to attend. Saturday's 9:00 until noon class is \$20.00 for BTQG members and \$30.00 for all others who wish to attend.

Purchase of Monique's \$8.00 pattern is required for each class. Fit to Be Geese ruler (\$15) and her Mini Fit to Be Geese ruler (\$12) purchase is optional, but they do maintain accurate size for the flying geese.

See other side for registration form and mail it to Sharon Lawler. Registration begins on August 1.

Supplies for classes: Sewing machine, rotary cutter and ruler and mat, thread & bobbins, pencil and paper, basic sewing supplies, and purchase of \$8.00 pattern on the morning of the class/classes.

Fabric requirements for Friday's "Victoria Rose" class for a 74" by 51" quilt top:

2 ¼ yards dark fabric (includes binding)

2 ½ yards light fabric

2 yards print fabric

3 1/3 yards of your choice of fabric for backing

Fabric requirements for Saturday's "67 Rambler" class for a 50" by 50" quilt top:

2 yards background fabric

¼ yard each of 9 dark fabrics

1 yard border fabric

½ yard binding

3 1/3 yards of your choice of fabric for backing

Precutting will help you start sewing sooner on the day of the class/classes.

Precutting directions for Friday's "Victoria Rose" class; all cuts are selvage to selvage:

Dark fabric, cut 2 strips at 3 ½" wide, set aside for strip piecing

Dark fabric, cut 12 strips at 1 ¾" wide, set aside for strip piecing

Dark fabric, cut 7 strips at 2 ½" wide for binding

Light fabric, cut 4 strips at 1 ¾" wide, set aside for strip piecing

Light fabric, cut 8 strips at 1 ¾" wide, and then cut these into 48 pieces of 1 ¾" by 6"

Light fabric, cut 3 strips at 3 ½" wide, set aside for strip piecing

Light fabric, cut 3 strips at 6" wide, set aside for strip piecing

Print fabric, cut 1 strip at 2 ½" wide, and then into 15 squares that are 2 ½" square

Print fabric, cut 2 strips at 15 ½" wide & then into 15 ½" squares, cut diagonally twice (setting triangles)

Print fabric, cut 2 squares at 8 inches each, and then cut diagonally once for corner triangles

Print fabric, cut 7 strips at 3" wide for border
