September Starlight Speaker and Workshops <u>Presented by Monique Dillard</u>

Winnipeg, Manitoba born, Monique Dillard's love of quilting was nurtured by her Canadian relatives. She lives in Rockford, Illinois now and has a national and worldwide audience of quilters. Monique honed her quilting skills by teaching for 15 years in a shop. You might open a quilting magazine to find her a feature guest. Monique has created six flying geese rulers, 76 quilting patterns and a variety quilting books.



Monique's free lecture is on **Thursday, September 27th at 7:00** pm at the Masonic Lodge off Highway 63 and Prathersville (directions to follow). Her quilt trunk show will feature 50 quilts and descriptions on the various techniques to create each.

Directions to the Masonic Lodge:

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The Masonic Lodge is north of I-70 on Highway 63 and exit onto the north outer road at the Prathersville exit (just north of the Fairgrounds exit). After you exit onto the Prathersville ramp from Highway 63, take the first outer road going north (left), which is North Masonic Drive and the Masonic Lodge is the SECOND building on that road. Address is 6033 North Masonic Drive. Park in the first parking lot, enter the building, and take the elevator down to the meeting room; or drive around to the lower level on the east of the building for easiest entry to the large, well-lit meeting room.

3 1/3 yards of your choice for backing

Pre-cutting directions will be given to you at registration.

Saturday, September 27, 9:00 to Noon Cost: \$20 67 Rambler Pattern \$8.00

Color choice decisions and accuracy techniques in cutting and pressing for block construction with Monique's "67 Rambler" pattern.

<u>Supplies for class</u>: Machine, rotary cutter & ruler & mat, thread, pencil, & basic sewing supplies.

Fabric requirements for Saturday to make a full-

bed sized "67 Rambler":

- 2 yards background fabric
- $\frac{1}{4}$ yard each of 9 dark fabrics
- 1 yard border fabric
- $\frac{1}{2}$ yard binding
- 3 1/3 yards of your choice for backing
