Hello again! So it's May! That means this is my last active month as pres./programs because we don't have chapter meetings in June. This has been a great year for me and I hope you have all enjoyed the programs. I managed to make it through with some money in the budget left over so I say we have a party! Our program is **Taming Your Quilting** by Judi Kirkpatrick. Judi will share her quilting journey, beginning with her Great Grandmother. Judi's mother and grandmother were both accomplished seamstresses who gave her a strong foundation in sewing skills. In the mid-1970's she moved to Brookfield, Mo from Illinois and joined a group of 12 ladies who were quilting. They started with the basics of hand piecing and quilting, building on each skill. Over the next 20 years the family moved to Nebraska, then Texas, and finally moving back to Missouri in 1997. Along the way Judi formed relationships with many quilters, learning different styles of quilting. In recent years she has been fascinated with the Modern Quilting style while still enjoying traditional quilts.

Over the years, like many of you, Judi's list of UFO's has grown and grown and gotten way out of hand. Last year she told herself, enough was enough, and developed a formula to "**Tame My Quilting**". Judi will share what she discovered through a handout that will walk each quilter through a path of discovery that will end in a plan to get those UFO's finished. It's working for her and hopefully it will work for you too.

Please be sure to bring a pencil or pen to use in completing your own personal worksheet.

So come early, eat, social and tame those UFOs. Bring a friend and don't forget your umbrella blocks!

She was working on appliqué the day she was hospitalized and she passed two weeks later of a stroke.

Thank you for accepting a challenge kit. There are a total of 18 kits so that is the total of your competition.

Each kit is unique-some have a lot of fabric, others less. They have been photographed and contents listed. Completed projects will be judged by 3 impartial and non-guild judges. We encourage you to be your best creative self. We welcome quilts, wall hangings, table runners, tote bags, place matswell, you get the drift. The items must be completed and returned by the September guild meetings. Judging will take place Friday of the Quilt Show weekend. There will be a grand prize



\$50.00 gift certificate from a local quilt shop for the best overall. The items will be hung together for the show, and a populace vote taken. The winner of that vote will receive a \$25.00 gift certificate. The items will be for sale, with the grand prize winner's item in the silent auction and the rest through Hand to Heart Market. Projects will have to remain displayed until at least Sunday afternoon so the populace vote can be fair, but the committee will see that they get to the purchaser. Now, THE RULES!

Each of the fabrics must be used...at least half of each piece.

Additional fabric may be used....up two yards each of 2 additional fabrics. This does not include backing. If you make a quilt sized article, you will use backing and can still use additional fabric as above.

There will be a non-monetary recognition for all who use all the fabric in the original kit.

There are 4 other categories that will be recognized by the Hand to Heart Market Committee:

We hope you will enjoy this challenge. It will help us use donated things and provide more items to show off our talents and earn dollarenos for our guild. Thanks!

Motions to report from April 2016 BTQG Board Meeting

The following Policy changes were approved by the BTQG Board of Directors on 4/11/16.

#6 Publications

f. The Membership Directory and Handbook shall include member information, by -laws, policies and procedures, and a list of planned chapter programs for the coming year.

#7 Quilt Show

g. Proceeds from the sale of items placed on consignment with the Quilt Show market shall be divided as follows: 70% to the member; 30% to the Guild.

#8 Retreat

b. The policy for BTQG retreats is as follows:

All registrations must be received by mail and be postmarked on or after the specified date or delivered to the workshop chairperson at a chapter meeting or in person after the postmark date.

All registrations for Guild events must be made individually: one person, one form, one check per envelope.

The Retreat Committee will maintain a waiting list of interested Guild members and attempt to fill vacancies from the waiting list.

Registrant who cancels may receive a refund if the cancellation does not result in a drop of registrations below the minimum required by the contracted facility and is made in writing a minimum of 21 days prior to the date of the retreat.

If a replacement attendee is provided, a full refund shall be made to the cancelling party.

#13 Committee Responsibilities

Membership: The Chairperson shall provide the treasurer with completed membership forms and dues in a timely manner. The chairperson shall develop a calendar of volunteers for each chapter meeting. These volunteers will greet members, introduce guests and manage the related functions of the membership table. The Membership Committee shall prepare the Membership Directory and Handbook and have it available to members at chapter meetings by October

Remove the following language:

#5 Membership

f. A NEW member is defined as a person who has never been a member of BTQG.

Hospitality: The Chairperson shall coordinate with program chairpersons to provide social functions such as luncheons, potluck meals, receptions and coffees. The chairperson shall supervise the hospitality budget and supplies and shall develop a calendar of volunteers to set up and take down the hospitality area for events

Membership Directory and Handbook Editor: The Membership Directory and Handbook Editor shall prepare the Membership Directory and Handbook and have it available to members at chapter meetings by October.

Webmaster: The Webmaster shall maintain the email list. Webmaster shall make monthly updates to the website including but not limited to information about upcoming programs and workshops, photos of activities, and such information as needed to present the guild to the guilt world.

Social Media: The Chairperson(s) will be a special ad hoc position that maintains the website, Facebook page and sends Eblasts. They are encouraged but not required to attend board meetings. They will com-
