Theresa, who has been a longarm quilter for over 14 years, will cover basic things you need to know before sending your quilt top out to be quilted. Whether you "quilt by check" or do your own machine quilting, you're sure to pick up a tip or design idea while enjoying Theresa's beautiful quilts. She will provide suggestions for keeping your quilt square during the quilting process, as well as quilting designs. Her trunk show consists of quilts that she has machine quilted, from simple designs to more elegant feather designs and background fills.

Mona Stevenson and Paraments

Liturgical paraments are hangings which enhance the worship experience by displaying meaningful emblems usually related to the church season. Paraments may be woven, embroidered or quilted.

Mona Stevenson has designed and quilted sets of paraments for three churches as well as stoles worn by ministers.

As you read the following article, please remember that it is the time of year when some of us will volunteer and some will be asked to take leadership roles in our Guild for the next year. Thanks in advance to all of them. The role for the rest of us is to support them and work with them. The Guild belongs to all of us and needs all of us to thrive and survive. Next year will be exciting as BTQG celebrates its 40th anniversary.



LESSONS FROM GEESE

1. As each goose flaps its wings it creates an uplift for the birds that follow. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 72% greater flying range than if each bird flew alone.

Lesson: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

2. When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back into formation to take advantage of the uplifting power of the bird immediately in front of it.

Lesson: If we have as much sense as a goose we stay in formation with those headed where we want to go. We are willing to accept their help and give our help to others.

3. When the lead goose tires, it rotates back into the formation and another goose flies to the point position.

Lesson: It pays to take turns doing hard tasks and sharing leadership. As with geese, people are interdependent on each other's skills, capabilities and unique arrangement of gifts, talents and resources.

4. The geese flying in formation honk to encourage those in front to keep up their speed.

Lesson: We need to make sure our honking is encouraging. In groups where there is encouragement, the production is much greater. The power of encouragement (to stand by one's heart or core values and encourage the heart and core of others) is the quality of honking we seek.

5. When a goose gets sick, wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation to help and protect it. They stay with it until it dies or is able to fly again. Then, they launch out with another formation or catch up with the flock.

Lesson: If we had as much sense as geese, we would stand by each other in difficult times as well as when we are strong.

"Lessons from Geese" has found worldwide circulation since it was written in 1972 by Dr. Robert McNeish, a biology teacher and student of nature from Baltimore.
