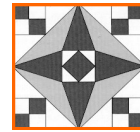

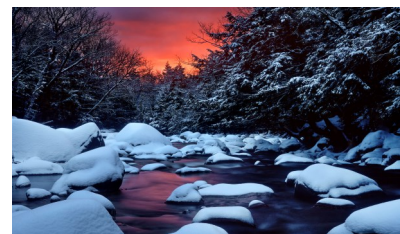

Our theme is "A Symphony of Quilts" and among the many other ribbons, we will be also awarding a ribbon for "Best Interpretation of Theme".

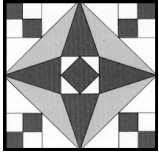

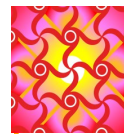
