This month Starlight attendees will have a complete change of pace. We'll be learning about the August total solar eclipse from an expert, Dr. Angela Speck a Professor and Director of Astronomy within the Physics & Astronomy Department at MU. She is currently co-chairing a taskforce to prepare the nation for the total solar eclipse. She built the MU astronomy program starting with her arrival at MU in 2002 and is responsible for mentoring MU students within and outside the Physics & Astronomy department with an interest in pursuing Astronomy/Astrophysics. She has a doctorate in Astronomy from University College London, and has been at Mizzou for 14 years.

Columbia is directly in the best visibility path of the eclipse – hotels here are already booked solid. This is not only a significant scientific occurrence, it is a major event for our community. A 70-mile-wide circle of darkness will cross us at midday on August 21. Come learn about this rare experience (last occurring here in 1869) from a lively and engaging speaker (tongue in cheek, she calls herself "the Eclipse Tsar"). **Invite** your family, neighbors and friends who might also have an interest in this topic.

Depending on Dr. Speck's schedule, we might have her talk at 7 PM, rather than after our business meeting.

Be sure to read the article elsewhere in this issue announcing a special solar eclipse **quilt challenge**.

It is wonderful! Thank you for donating the items and thank you to those of you who packed the bags!



QUILT CHALLENGE

To mark the upcoming solar eclipse, we're having a quilt challenge with the predictable theme: Solar Eclipse. This will be a judged challenge with prizes (to be determined later). The rules are simple, make a quilt (three layers - top, batting or filler, backing), with edges bound or otherwise finished, of any size to interpret the challenge theme. Your entry may be a wall quilt, placemat, table topper, postcard, bed guilt or even a handbag. It may be a traditional pieced or appliqued guilt, or an art guilt incorporating paint, dye, or embellishments. An entry form will be available in a future issue. The deadline for entries is Monday July 10, giving our judge time to examine the entries and return them for our August meetings – just before the eclipse. Turn your entries in to Mona Stevenson. Winners will be announced at the August 3 Starlight meeting.



April Lock-In

After unanimous positive feedback about last year's quilt lock-in, we've booked Theresa Ward again for an April 7 mystery quilt day. She will do a program for Starlight the night before. In both cases, it will be new material. We'll have more
