Edie McGinnis is the former associate editor of Kansas City Star Quilts. She has published 18 quilt books, written articles for quilt magazines and has had several single patterns published. She contributed as a columnist on The Star's former web site Pickledish.com. In 2015, Kansas City Star Quilts was sold to C&T Publishing. She now is the technical writer for *Block Magazine* for Missouri Star Quilt Co. in Hamilton, Missouri.

Edie gives lectures and trunk shows on The Kansas City Star quilt patterns, their history and the designers who worked at The Star in the early years, Feedsacks, Scrap quilts and using precuts.

She recently added a trunk show and classes based on her latest book, *Finders Keepers Quilts*, released in January of 2015. It tells the story of a cache of quilts found in an abandoned farmhouse in Bloomfield, lowa. The quilts were reproduced in reproduction fabrics and in modern contemporary fabrics for an updated look.

She has taught quilting at Primitives of the Midwest in Lee's Summit, Missouri, and various workshops using her own original patterns. She has been quilting for more than 35 years and is a member of the American Quilting Society.

Edie started her quilting career as a member of BTQG - she sent us some memories -

"Booneslick Trail Quilt Guild was the first guild I joined when I first began quilting. My mother-in-law gave me some antique blocks made of turkey red and muslin fabric. I needed fabric for the sashing and the border. That's when I discovered Bettina Havig's quilt shop. One of the ladies that worked there helped me select fabric for my quilt. I was so proud of my quilt when I finished it! I took it to guild and showed it off at Show and Tell. Guild members must have been feeling particularly kind that day because I was told how pretty it was. It was only after I became more proficient and practiced as a quilter, that I realized what a horrible job I had done in constructing that quilt! I've learned a lot since that then."
