October will an especially exciting month for the Day Chapter. Our guest speaker is Carol Jones. Carol of Lawrence, Kansas, has co-authored two books with her friend, and quilt collaborator, Bobbi Finley, who lives in San Jose, California. Their first book was *Tile Quilt Revival*:

Reinventing a Forgotten Form, C&T Publishing. Their next book was Fresh Perspectives: Reinventing 18 Classic Quilts from the International Quilt Study Center & Museum, C&T Publishing.

Carol's quilts have twice been featured on the cover of Quilters Newsletter, many times in the pages of that magazine as well as American Quilter, in Patchwork Tsushin, on the cover of Barbara Brackman's America's Printed Fabrics 1770-1890, and in many other publications, including Judi Warren Blaydon's Collage + Cloth = Quilt. In 2004 and 2005, a guilt made by Carol with Bobbi Finley and Georgann Eglinski traveled throughout Japan in the exhibition, Japanese Imagery in One Hundred Quilts, which featured the work of 75 artists from Japan and 25 artists from other countries. In the fall of 2013, twelve free-form wall guilts, Carol's Calendar of Quilts, was exhibited at the Strecker-Nelson Pop Up Gallery in Manhattan, Kansas. Among the topics Carol lectures on is the nineteenth-century type of appliqué quilts known as tile quilts and the recent revival of the genre. Her presentation at our meeting will be on Tile Quilt Revival. Carol was here for a workshop on Tile quilts several years ago and the range of information about this style of quilt has continued to expand. If you took that workshop please bring any project you completed to share both with Carol and with our members.

In addition to our speaker we will have as our guests about twenty quilters from the United Kingdom. They will join us for a salad luncheon and will also be bringing "show 'n tell". The tour group will have begun their two-week tour of American quilting with our quilt show and meeting. Please come and welcome them to the USA!

Don't miss this meeting. We will open the doors for Sit and Sew at 9:00am.

Ouilt Show Entries

Your entries for the 2016 BTQG quilt show should be delivered to Stoney Creek Inn between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon on Friday, September 30th. Remember that your quilt needs a sleeve and that the label you printed when you entered your quilt, needs to be attached to the back. Hang on to your claim check. You will need it to claim your quilt after the show. Quilts will be ready for pickup on Sunday, October 2nd at 6 p.m.

LET'S PLAY DOLLS:

Workshop fee \$15, Class to be held Oct. 22, 2016, 9:00 - noon at Quilt 4 U, 908 Rain Forest Pkwy, Columbia, MO 65205

Is there some poor little doll huddling somewhere without a quilt? Let's correct that. If you are a grandmother needing to have a quilt for your pretend great grandchild or just like small quilts this is the workshop for you. The quilt will be a seven panel "strippy" quilt either 26" x 30" or 16 1/2" x 22 1/2". You choose the size. The process is exactly the same. Students will piece four patch blocks to be set into "strippy" panels. You will learn how to align the blocks in the panels for straight lines across to avoid a wavy finish. It's perfect for an American Girl™ doll. All the planning and calculations have been done for you so you can just have fun. (This size makes great preemie quilts.)

Supply list:

1/8 yard each of five small prints, medium to dark, 5/8 yard of a medium scale print 1/2 yard of a background print that will contrast with the small prints rotary cutter, mat, and ruler (6"x 12" will be fine) scissors and seam ripper sewing machine, cord and power foot neutral thread and pre-wound bobbins straight pins pencil or colored pencil visible on your medium print. All workshops require a chalkboard or flip chart.

Workshop fee is \$15 per person. Registration is open immediately. Registration form on pg 7.
