Our speaker on Thursday July 5 is Barb Eikmeier from Lansing, Kansas. Her topic is "The Quilted Basket, An American Classic". When a friend pointed out how many basket quilts Barb has made, this quilt program was born! Her presentation includes antique quilts, new quilts and a mini show of sewing baskets with trivia about baskets. Quilting since 1984 and teaching quilting since 1990, she is also the author of four books, including "Back Basting Applique Step by Step" published by Martingale and Co. and a fabric designer for Paintbrush Studio. Her husband's career as an Army officer has led them to homes in several regions of the US, as well as South Korea, exposing her to many quilting styles. Barb considers herself a traditional quilter and applique is her favorite quilting technique.

I hope we'll have a good turnout for this lovely program. It should appeal to many of our day chapter members, and since it stays light so late, I hope some of them will venture out to join us.

She needs to drive back to Kansas that night, so she'd like to do her presentation before our business meeting. The presentation will precede the regular meeting activities, so don't be late.





Threadneedle Street's Secret Garden Challenge

You may be surprised to learn that just off Threadneedle Street is a secret garden for quilters. It's just perfect after a morning of shopping on Threadneedle Street. There's a place to have tea, or margaritas, share ideas or just soak up the beautiful flowers and setting to plan a new quilt from new purchases or your increasing stash. There is even a Booneslick Trail. Wonderful garden gnomes take care of all the work and provide new palettes of color and hues in their continued changing of floral arrangements. There are quilting gnomes who are ready to provide help for each quilting question. Quilting gnomes have all the answers.

Unfortunately, a powerful ugly troll has taken over the garden and captured the helpful gnomes. His spell has created chaos. Now quilters are facing cut off points, wavering quarter inch seams, chopped off triangles and flying geese going South. The troll has guaranteed spreading fat quarters, wobbly jelly rolls, wiggling paper piecing and three stitches per inch for every quilter on the Booneslick Trail. The gnomes plead for help: that we meet the troll's challenge and break the spell!!!

THE CHALLENGE: CREATE A GARDEN QUILT

Use all of the troll fabric supplied by the guild. Use the fabric at least three times on the front of the quilt. The fabric may be altered – cut, dyed, appliqued, etc. Size shall be no smaller than 14" x 16." Larger sizes are up to you but quilt must be finished before the quilt show. Use at least five words on the quilt. Be inspired! Be creative! Save the gnomes! Break the spell!!! Challenge entries are due at quilt check in for the quilt show that will be October 5-6.
