The Starlight program notes.

"Where Poppies Grow" will be presented by Denniele Bohannon who designed a quilt honoring all those who served in WWI including her great grandfather, Almo, a World War I soldier whose letters home were preserved in the family. Her original blocks were published in series in the Kansas City Star a 2014 followed by the publication of her book WHERE POPPIES GROW the same year.

Denniele has been teaching quilt making in the adult education programs in Harrisonville Schools since 2007. She was a member of NQA and is a member of MOKA an organization for quilt historians in Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas and Arkansas. (Ask her about that group, you might be interested in attending their gatherings.)

She has five grown children and, at the time of the book's publication, three grandchildren. She will be staying with a new grandchild while visiting us in October.

The US entered WWI in the summer of 1917 and armistice was signed in November of 1918. Denniele will share Almo's story nearly 100 years after those letters arrived.

Both Denniele and I recommend the WWI Memorial in Kansas City. It is a comprehensive retelling of the war beautifully designed and the only national museum dedicated to WWI. You enter the museum across a glass bridge over a field of poppies.

"The Finder"

Around my house we seem to spend too much time searching for the 'lost'. We usually find it but not until very possible location has been checked twice...once because that's where it should be and the second time because we can't believe it wasn't there...sometimes it was there.

Recently a member mentioned a book title that she hoped to find. Several of us looked at home to see if we had the book. Meantime she found the book online and purchased it. It occurred to me that we can offer our own "search" service. Meet "The Finder". If you are looking for a book, pattern, or a fabric needed to complete or begin a project send the information to our newsletter editor, Marilyn Wooldridge. Make sure the information is complete. If it's fabric and you have a small swatch send that or scan it and send the scan. And, then be patient while the search can begin. Wait until the newsletter comes out then cross you fingers that we, as a group, can find what you're looking for.

Announcing a block design competition.

Design a 12 inch finished pieced block containing a center square and 40 additional pieces (total 41) to celebrate our 40th anniversary. If designing an appliqué block the background counts as the center square and the rest of the design must contain 40 pieces. Entry deadline is either January chapter meeting. Design the block and make a sample. Our anniversary luncheon speaker will be the judge. There will be prizes and the blocks selected will be used to produce a quilt for the quilt show. You may use any style fabrics you wish; 1900s, batik, 30s, or "modern".
