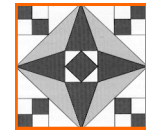

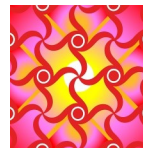

Quilt Show Viewer's Choice



There were so many beautiful quilts in this year's BTQG Quilt Show.

We are happy to announce, "A Bountiful Life", by Willie Morris, was selected as the 2018 BTQG Quilt Show Viewer's Choice.

"A Bountiful Life", pattern by Karen Mowery, is an adaptation of the Bird Paradise quilt top in the American Folk Art Museum. In 2014 a group of BTQG members and former members started meeting once a month. All were working on their interpretation of the quilt. Willie was the first to complete her quilt but several are close. The twenty blocks and four borders are done with needle turn appliqué with most of the fabrics 1800s reproductions. Several of the blocks have embellishments with sequins, beads, embroidery, and twilling. The quilt was custom machine quilted by Lee Robertson of Quilt 4 You in Weston, MO. The quilting has 297,256 stitches with 57 thread changes. It took almost four years to complete the quilt.

Karla Menaugh Workshop

Karla Menaugh's workshop on Heirloom-Quality Machine Applique is November 6th. There are a few spots left for the workshop so send in your registration soon. The registration form and the supply list are in the October newsletter. The workshop will be at Quilt 4U from 9:30 a.m. til 4 p.m.

Heirloom-Quality Machine Appliqué - Learn to machine appliqué with a technique that so closely mimics hand appliqué that most people won't be able to tell the difference without their reading glasses! Bring your sewing machine, fabric, and sewing supplies to class for hands-on instruction as you begin a folk art block designed by class teacher Karla Menaugh and Barbara Brackman, quilt historian. For the past 15 years, Menaugh has co-authored books and patterns about classic quilts with Barbara Brackman, including *Emporia Rose Appliqué Quilts* from C&T Publishing, and the *Quiltmaker's Guide to Fine Machine Appliqué* from their Sunflower Pattern Co-operative. Using their original designs, she shares her tips and techniques for making machine-appliqued quilts that look like they are hand-appliqued.

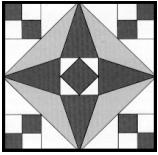

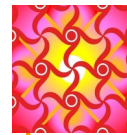
