She has been published in numerous magazines, including Quilt, Quilt Sampler, Fabric Trends, Quilting for Christmas, Quilt Almanac, Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks, Fons and Porter Scrap Quilts, and Fons and Porter Easy Quilts.

Sit and Sew Class for September 10th

To all interested, we will be taught to make these lovely trivets! You will be provided with a pattern and the Insul-Fleece. You will need to bring a fat quarter for the backing, and 20 or so 1 and 5/8" strips. Bring at least 10-12" lengths. Also needed: Sewing machine, extra cord, small cutting mat, ruler and rotary cutter, thread of course, small iron and pressing mat if you have them. The trivets that we make in class will be donated to the market place for the Quilt Show and the \$5.00 charge for the class will be designated to help allay the cost for the Sit and Sew hours. If possible, please have correct change. Pre register by email or phone or text to me, "Hank" Botts @ jackandhank@mchsi.com, 573-424-1190. It would be great to have at least 20 participants. This pattern came to us from Barb Preis, a new member, and her guild in Arizona had 45 of these trivets at their show and sold all but 1!!

If you are going to mail your entry(s), those need to be in the mail by September 12th. Your quilt will need a sleeve. There is also a link to how to attach a sleeve to your quilt on the website. Please enter your quilts soon. That gives us some idea of how many to plan for in designing the layout.

Quilt Show Marketplace Donations needed

The committee will meet one or more times in late September to price and tag all of our merchandise, so we need to have everything collected by the 20th .

We've had some lovely donations, so far, and look forward to seeing what else you've sewn up. Even small things, such as handmade Christmas ornaments will be helpful. You may also wish to clear your sewing area of unused tools, books, patterns, etc. that someone else might find useful. We'll also take quilting magazines from about 2005 and newer. A big part of our funding for the next two years comes from Marketplace proceeds, so your efforts are needed and appreciated.

As far as items to make, we could use:

- a few dish scrubbies (we have 3 left),
- microwave bowls (3 left; I have some microwave-safe batting, is someone has a pattern),
- possibly Christmas stockings (sold 4 of 9),
- table runners,
- and casserole carriers.
- Seasonal items usually do well for Halloween, harvest and Christmas.

Save the Date

Karla Menaugh will be doing a lecture for the Day Chapter meeting on November 5th and a workshop on November 6th.

Below is a description of her workshop.



Heirloom-Quality Machine Appliqué - Learn to machine appliqué with a technique that so closely mimics hand appliqué that most people won't be able to tell the difference without their reading glasses! Bring your sewing machine, fabric, and sewing supplies to

class for hands-on instruction as you begin a folk art block designed by class teacher Karla Menaugh and Barbara Brackman, quilt historian. For the past 15 years, Menaugh has co-authored books and patterns about classic quilts with Barbara Brackman, including *Emporia Rose Appliqué Quilts* from C&T Publishing, and the *Quiltmaker's Guide to Fine Machine Appliqué* from their Sunflower Pattern Co-operative. Using their original designs, she shares her tips and techniques for making machine-appliqued quilts that look like they are hand-appliqued.
