#### Hello Guild Members -

#### **COVID-19 Information**

I'm sure you are as jittery as I am about this new virus. It has been suggested that we cancel the April Chapter meetings. At this point, it seems a bit premature to make that decision. Rest assured that we are watching the situation and will make a go / no go decision by the beginning of the last week of March. It's only courteous to give our speakers a little advance warning if we decide to cancel the meetings. If the meetings are cancelled, we will send out an email blast to the membership. If you do not have access to email, call a friend who does.

If we decide to go forward with the meetings, we'll adjust the room set up so that there is more personal space between chairs. We're fortunate that the room we meet in is large enough to allow us to space the chairs at least 19" to 24" apart for more "social distance."

#### Heartland Quilt Network

The Heartland Quilt Network meeting on Saturday April 4, was cancelled because of COVID-19. They are going to send the information from speakers to each guild that was registered to attend.

#### Quilt Show Update

The bookmarks advertising the quilt show have been ordered and will be available for distribution beginning the last week of March. We decided to double the quantity of bookmarks so that we are able to distribute to stores downtown during the month of September for added publicity prior to the show. The Opportunity Quilt tickets will be available at the same time. The price for the Opportunity Quilt drawing will be \$1 each or six tickets for \$5. The Board voted to increase the price of admission to the Quilt Show to \$7. If people want to buy Opportunity Quilt tickets at the door, you'll receive four tickets plus admission for \$10.

#### 2020 Quilt Show Challenge – Everything Old is New Again

Make a small quilt, no more than 24" on any side, using <u>one</u> traditional block – pieced or applique - in a contemporary (not necessarily "Modern") way. For this challenge, traditional will be defined as a block designed before 1940.

#### Examples

- Churn dash blocks could be assembled "wonky" in hot pink and lime.
- A wedding ring could be made "Modern" a la Victoria Findley Wolfe.
- Neon flying geese could wander across a night sky.
- In a Baltimore block, the traditional eagle might be replaced with a flamingo or the traditional house with an RV.
- Sunbonnet Sue could be doing something modern, such as wind surfing or texting.
- For a pictorial art quilt, the block might appear as the sides of buildings or be the pavement of a patio. The quilt may be a single block or multiples of the one block. It may have sashing and/or borders. The block must be recognizable. The quilt need not be square or rectangular.

The quilt must be 3 layers, quilted by hand or machine, with edges finished (bound, faced, satin-stitched, couched yarn, etc.) No sleeve is required, since the quilts will be displayed together, pinned to a backdrop.

Complete the online entry form for your quilt, when that becomes available. When you turn in your entry in on the Thursday before the show, pin a black and white copy/drawing of the traditional block to the quilt. You may draw the outline of the block or use a photocopy from a pattern book. The copy should be 6-8" square and include the name of the block. Any questions?

# Quilt Show 2020 on Friday and Saturday October 2nd and 3rd at The State Historical Society of Missouri at 605 Elm Street

When we think of the Quilt Show, our minds immediately go to the beautiful quilts we have seen in past shows! The Quilt Show Committee is asking that you all start thinking about what quilts you want to enter in this year's show. In order to get the program, map insert, and layout done in a timely and accurate manner, the deadline for entering your quilt will be September 10th. Willie Morris has again graciously volunteered to do the quilt entries and will let us know all the specifics as we get closer to the time of the show.

We would like to have some antique quilts to display in the show to weave into our historical theme and setting. We did clarify there will be room to do a bed turning, so please be thinking about some antique and current quilts for the bed turning also!

All quilts will need have a label attached to the bottom left corner (right corner if looking at the back of the quilt). And all quilts larger than 24 inches square will need to have a sleeve for hanging. For sleeve instructions go to <a href="https://docs.python.org/btqs.missouri.org">btqg.missouri.org</a>. Click on Quilt Show, then click on instructions for putting on a sleeve in the paragraph below the block of Willie Morris's tree block.

You must be a paid member to enter or sponsor a quilt. No quilt may be entered that has been in the quilt show in the past 5 years unless voted Viewers' Choice in the last show.

We also still need volunteers for committees! Opportunity Quilt Ticket Sales, Silent Auction, Volunteer Coordinator, Set-up, Program/Publications, and Demonstrations chairpersons are needed! We could still use people to assist with Publicity/Advertising and Bed Turning. #### 2020 QUILT SHOW NEWS



2020 has begun, Happy New Year! Now, it's time to get serious about the 2020 Quilt Show...

The committee has worked hard to secure a new space and good dates for the Show, we've come up with a theme and a logo, the Redwork group has stitched and is making progress putting together an Opportunity Quilt. Now we're counting on YOU to help make the show a success. Here are some details:

**WHAT: This is the Guild's Biennial Quilt Show.** As 2020 marks the Bicentennial of the founding of Boone County & 2021 the Bicentennial of the City of Columbia we've chosen a theme that ties guilting into the history of our communities.

Block by block a quilt is sewn, Block by block a community has grown.

For a logo we've been given permission to use the square, guild member, Willene Morris made of the Burr Oak. Her block was chosen to represent Boone County on a quilt being made for the State 2021 Bicentennial. We've made arrangements for someone to make a digital interpretation that will make printing easy.

WHEN: The Quilt Show will be held Friday and Saturday, October 2nd and 3rd, 2020.

Set up will be Thursday, October 1st. Please, mark your calendars now.

WHERE: The State Historical Society of Missouri, 605 Elm Street

the new building is in town, across from Peace Park, with its own parking lot.

**WHO**: This is where YOU come in...we need help in many areas, some large and some

small, there's definitely something to engage you all!

**HOW**: Right now we're looking for help (people to head up) the following areas:

- ⇒ **Demonstrations** we'd like to have some demonstrations someone hand quilting/sewing squares and someone sewing with a machine (Featherweight ?) We need someone to organize this and members to volunteer to sit & sew during the show.
- ⇒ **Past to Present** we'd like to hang a few quilts that show the evolution of quilting. For example, we'd hang an antique log cabin quilt next to a modern interpretation of the log cabin pattern. For this we need YOU to let us know what quilts you have that would fit into this category. One need not have both old and new quilts, we'll match up what's available.
- ⇒ **Challenge** See the Quilt Show Challenge article in the newsletter.
- ⇒ **Service Projects** we would like to have a display of the many service projects guild members sew for, with photos and appreciations from recipients. We'll need someone to pull this together and for you to keep sewing bags and quilts, etc.
- ⇒ **Silent Auction** we need someone to organize gathering items.
- ⇒ **Opportunity Quilt Tickets** we need someone to oversee getting and selling of opportunity quilt tickets.
- ⇒ Market Place we need you all to be sewing things to sell at the Market Place, remember this is where we bring in the money!
