

Swap Meet

The August Day Guild Meeting will include a "Swap Meet" from 11am to 12:30pm prior to the Program at 1pm. Tables will be set up for members to put out quilting items they no longer want. Examples are good quilting fabric, quilt patterns, quilt books, tools etc. No \$ will be exchanged, all items must be free.

Like the old saying "one person's junk is another's treasure" I think the same can be said for your quilting items. Someone else might be looking for that fabric you now think is ugly, or "what was I thinking?"

Here is the catch: YOU must bag up any unclaimed items you brought to donate to charity, or if unsuitable, to the dumpster. Please don't just abandon items in the meeting room. After this meeting I will fill my car to deliver the suitable donated items. For future use, below is a list of a few places that accept donations. If you know of more, please let me know.

Mobility Worldwide MO—Columbia, 4825 E Meyer Industrial Drive, Columbia, MO 573-886-7877 (formerly known as The Pet Project) is happy to have fabric, including dressmaking materials, even polyester. Please wash before donating. They also like any notions such as thread, zippers, buttons, trims, needles and embroidery thread etc. They also refurbish donated sewing machines to send out to people who need them to help support their families. Be sure to include the foot pedal and power cord. They even take the old black Singer type machines.

If you know of other agencies who take supply donations, please let us know, so we can add them to our list!

A MYSTERY TO SOLVE

I hope you can help me solve a mystery and bring a smile to the family of one of our passed members. A year or two ago a family member of a deceased guild member brought items from her sewing room to a guild meeting, to give away. There were several quilt tops, hoops, patterns and odds and ends.

After the meeting I went back to see what was left and I was surprised to see that a nine-patch quilt she had started quilting was still there. The quilt was about a third of the way quilted, and I was so happy to see all ages of fabrics framed by the cream colored solid blocks. Some of the fabrics must have been from her scraps because there were pieces from feed sacks, 1970's up to maybe the 2000's. I love hand quilting so I took it in hopes finishing it myself, but health issues kept me from working on it.

I considered several options and decided to donate the quilt to the St. Mary's Quilt Guild, which makes the quilts for the St. Mary's Medical Scholarship annual fundraiser called the Ice Cream Social. I'm so happy to tell you that the quilt was finished and was highlighted as one of two vintage quilts used for their raffle. The picture of the finished quilt didn't make it to me or it would've been here with the story. This quilt has had a lot of life and I'd love to pass on the brochure it's featured in to the family. I'm sure they'd love to know that their loved one's UFO has made a real difference in the world.

Each quilt has a superpower, and that superpower is the ability to give joy in the most interesting and unexpected ways.
