


*Modern quilts are primarily functional and inspired by modern designs

*Modern quilters work in different styles and define modern quilting in different ways, but several characteristics often appear which may help identify a modern quilt. These include, but are not limited to:

- -- the use of bold colors and prints, high contrast, and graphic area of solid color,
- -- improvisational piecing,
- -- minimalism,
- -- expansive negative space, and
- -- alternate grid work.

"Modern traditionalism" or the updating of classic quilt designs is also often seen in modern quilting.
