

Items need not be sewing related. Perhaps you have a decorative item, holiday décor, or unused small appliance. Themed baskets could help someone finish their holiday shopping. Ideas include movie night, spa, breakfast treats. Services are also popular. For example, you may offer to cut, attach and tack down up to 400" of binding on a quilted top. Or bake a number of desserts over a period of time. If you're a long-armer, you might offer to quilt a queen-size top or its equivalent in smaller pieces — backing, batting to be provided by bidder, perhaps. This coming year there will be big quilt shows in Branson and Overland Park; you could volunteer to chauffeur the bidder and a friend for a single day trip; or, drive a shop hop or Hamilton excursion. If you're offering a service, please print up a card describing it and any specifications, such as a time period or limitations.

As for the meal, our CEO, Janet, has offered to provide ham as the entree. We always have bountiful tables of salads, hot dishes, and breads to go with that. Then there are the desserts. I've never gone away hungry from a guild potluck. Beverages will include coffee, hot tea and water. If the committee gets fancy, there might be punch or lemonade. Please be sure to bring a serving utensil for your dish, if one is required. Ovens will be on to keep hot dishes hot. The meal will begin at noon.

So, bring a dish to share and something for the auction. And don't forget some cash, your checkbook or your credit card. I'm sorry to miss the party this year. I always enjoy the food, the fellowship and the fun of the auction. Our auctioneer this year is Alice Leeper, whose sense of humor is sure to make for an entertaining event.
