


combinations for quilts, as long as the "flavor" of the fabrics played well together. Just like ice cream, who can ever try just one flavor?

Becky might begin with a favorite quilt block, select at least 50 fabrics, and plan an interesting setting or develop a unique border to create visual interest with color and pattern, much like testing a "recipe" for the perfect cinnamon roll.

You'll enjoy over 30 quilts that Becky considers to be "controlled scrappy" quilts, each created with at least 50 to 100 fabrics ranging from reproduction to seasonal to modern. You'll learn how to make yourself a prolific quilter by using leaders and enders to ultimately create a future quilt while you're sewing on your current project.

A published quilt designer for Need'l Love Company, Becky's designs include the Twister Holiday and Twister Harvest Wreath quilts; Twister Frosty, Snowman Stars, Rose Maison, and more. Her original quilt designs have been featured several times on the cover of American Patchwork & Quilting magazine.

Given the title of her program, there just might be some treats that afternoon, so come and enjoy. And don't forget Sit 'n Sew in the morning, where you can catch up with your friends and introduce yourself to some of our newest members while working on a hand or machine project.

Also, our speaker will be doing a workshop on sewing the Hunter's Star block – check out the article in this newsletter for details and how to sign up.

Hunter's Star Workshop

Our speaker for Day Chapter, Monday, May 1st, 2023, is Becky Cogan from Independence, MO. She is going to teach a class in the morning before the meeting, teaching us to make a Hunter's Star block without any specialized rulers. Class will be from 9:30 am to noon. You will have time to make more than one block. The photos show some examples of Hunter's Star quilts that Becky has made or is working on right now. The cost is \$25 per person, and there will be room for up to 20 participants.







SUPPLIES:

9 1/2" square ruler (not required, but makes it easier to square up the block) long ruler to cut 9 1/2" square in half diagonally small ruler 3x6 or 4x8 marking pen or pencil rotary cutter cutting mat at least 12" square sewing machine, general sewing supplies, iron/ironing board or pad

FABRIC: For class, bring at least two 10" squares of print fabric and two 10" squares of background fabric. Each print square will make two blocks. If you want to bring more, you may! Have your fabric cut, ironed, and starched (if desired) before class.

If you think you'll want to make an entire quilt, a layer cake of 42 squares will make 84 blocks. You also may use fat quarters or yardage. If you use a layer cake, you'll need three yards of background fabric. The finished blocks will be 8" or 7.5", depending on how you square them up after sewing. If you are using a layer cake, check to make sure the squares are all 10"; if not, you will need to square them up (and your background fabric) to be the same size. You might have to square to 9.5" to start.

A Thank-You Note From Service Projects

Thank you, Thank you! We had two very productive work days in March and now quilts and tops are coming back! Which is great, but I need help on the quilting and binding end! Lynn and I can do several demonstrations on how to do the big stitch by hand with #10 cotton thread, very cute and lots of texture! They can also be machine stitched with just grids (walking foot will help) or a meander design on your domestic machine. We will have several demos set up at the Sit 'n Sew Monday morning on May 1st. Hand sewing is very meditative and relaxing, come and join in the fun!

I took 16 quilts to Ronald McDonald House, 22 quilts to the adult Chemo and 11 quilts and receiving blankets to the pediatric Chemo units at MU hospital and 15 quilts plus a pillowcase to True North. See attached picture! We offered quilts to Rainbow House, but they had just received a large donation of blankets from Project Linus, so they declined this time, due to lack of storage space.

Your hands are a blessing to many. Thank you from the bottom of my heart!

Book Review

PIECED BORDERS, The Complete Resource, by Judy Martin and Marsha McCloskey


Finally, a book with a title that really reflects its contents. Even though the book was published in 1994, no treatment of pieced borders has been better presented or more comprehensive than this book. Both Judy and Marsha are great quiltmakers in their own right, so

the combination of ideas makes it possible to give any quiltmaker, novice or experienced, a plethora of doable designs. There are dozens of color and black and white photos of quilts using some of the border designs. The borders are easily sized to your quilt, and templates and charts lead right to the final results. The templates in the back of the book can be translated to rotary cutting or acrylic templates.

Any quilt can be improved by adding a border. With the current interest in medallion quilts the border designs can move a quilt into a better final result by supplying ideas for the sequence of borders needed.

This book is in our guild library or it can be found by searching online. Clearly some of our members weren't "born" into the quilting world yet in 1994 but it's high time early useful books got their due. Enough said.
