

Quilt Show Wrap-Up Report

After four years we had a quilt show again! The 155 quilts were amazing!! Here are some of the highlights:

Approximately 372 people attended with ticket sales of \$1,860.

Silent Auction yielded \$1,000.

Ticket sales for the Opportunity Quilts brought in \$839.

Market Place sales totaled \$7,500.

Total income for the quilt show was \$11,205. Expenses for the show were \$2,289 which gave us a net profit of \$8,915.

Lana Bartlett of Columbia won the "Whimsical Garden" opportunity quilt.

Diane Gorski of State College, Pennsylvania won the "Blizzard Buddies" opportunity quilt.

Debbie Odor won the Small Quilt Viewer's Choice Award with "Winter Tree."
