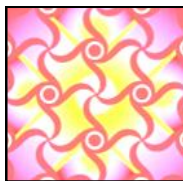

He will explain how he makes his work - by cutting fabrics into pieces, then using a "cut & glue" or "hold & sew" technique, raw edge machine applique, textile painting, and threadwork. Most are completed using free-motion machine quilting. Each piece is then matted and framed under glass. Dave will have original pieces to show, as well as prints and notecards to sell. 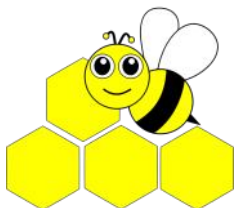

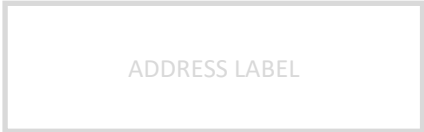

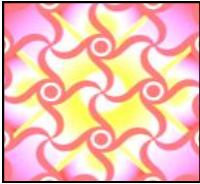
