VACANCY! 2024-2025 Day Chapter President

You have the opportunity to make a difference in our guild. We are still on the search for a Day Chapter President for 2024-2025. Your reign will be from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

YOUR Presidency does NOT need to look like anyone else's. You can add your own flair and your own unique contributions to the Day Chapter meetings. You can decide we all need to take a breath and have a super easy year. To be an elected officer of the Guild, you need to:

- Be a Guild member for 1 year as of July 1, 2024
- Attend Board Meetings on the 2nd Monday of each month

There are seven mentions of the chapter president in the Guild By Laws and Policies. The only requirements of the Day Chapter President are outlined in the Guild By Laws:

- Chapter Presidents are a member of the Board of Directors (Article 4: Section 1)
- Chapter Presidents shall preside at chapter meetings (Article 4: Section 3. 5.)

There are five references to the Day Chapter President in the Guild Policies, but those can be easily modified by a Board vote. I want to take a minute to explain these.

- Chapter meetings will be planned by the Program Chair in coordination with the Chapter President (1.b.)

 The Chapter President doesn't need to be overly involved. The Program Committee does all the leg work on this, but they work together to make sure speakers are welcome and introduced properly at meetings.
- In reference to online meetings, the chapter president or designated Chairperson will ensure that the membership receives the login information via email prior to the meeting (1.c.ii) The Zoom account has been set up by the CEO or Program Committee. They set up the link, give it to the Newsletter Chair and Social Media Chair for distribution to membership.
- Part of the budget committee (11) You work with the Treasurer and CEO on this. It is short-lived in March/April and not much work.
- Work with the program chairperson to build a volunteer system of members for needs at meetings (13.
 b.) This can honestly be just asking someone day of to do whatever needs to be done. Our guild is full of helpful people who are willing to do small tasks when asked.
- Notify the Social Media Chairperson if a meeting is cancelled. (14.b.) We follow CPS school cancellation. This is a rare occurrence and not one where you make the decision alone. The entire Board is involved.

The Job Description covers several things, but that's just what others have done before you. It isn't what you have to do. Remember! Make this YOUR Presidency.



Day Chapter Discovers the History of Quilts in Miniature

Carol Elmore, an American Quilter's Society Certified Appraiser since 1995, will present the "History of Quilts in Miniature" at the Monday, May 6, Day Chapter meeting. The meeting begins at 1 p.m.

Using miniature and small quilts from her collection, Carol lectures on the history of quilt making in the United States. Quilts in this lecture are both historic ones, reproductions of historic quilts and new quilts that are miniature, crib, doll and wall quilt sizes.

Carol says her interest in quilting began in the 1950s, when she observed her mother at work. In the 1960s and 1970s, mother and daughter started sewing together. Both her grandmothers and great-grandmothers were also quilters. She has been making and collecting quilts herself for more than 35 years.

Her interests and talents in quilting endeavors include workshops and programs in written appraisals of antique quilts, contemporary quilts and other quilted textiles for insurance replacement value, fair market value and donation value.

Carol retired in 2018 after working in university libraries in Kansas. Her husband, Ron, is also a quilter specializing in Log Cabin quilts. He is a veterinarian and was a professor at Kansas State University; he retired 2022. The couple settled in Olathe, Kansas, after they retired.

They have one son, Andrew, and two granddaughters. The elder one, now 17, worked on quilts with her grandfather when she was younger, but she now favors costume design. Ron and Carol are in the process of making a quilt for the 6-year-old granddaughter.

Starlight Piecemakers Meet a "Judy Junkie"

Helen Feldker, calls herself a "Judy Junkie" based on her admiration and appreciation for the work of Judy Niemeyer, the famed quilter known for her paper piecing techniques among other talents.

Ergo, Helen, who recently completed her second retreat in Texas with Niemeyer, will be presenting "Judy Junkie and other Exploits in Quilting" at the Starlight Chapter meeting on Thursday, May 2, at 7 p.m.

The program will focus on paper piecing, a technique she's been doing for about a dozen years. She also teaches ruler quilting, free motion and landscape quilting. "I put what I learn into practice," she said, when talking about how she brings her retreat experience to the classroom.

In June, she is planning to teach a course at Appletree Quilting Center to make a quilt titled, "Peaceful Snowfall." It's 99" x 99."

When she's not quilting, she is a nurse practitioner, who along with the attending physician, treats patients in the advance heart failure department at the Veterans Administration Hospital.

Helen was born in Illinois, and the family moved to Missouri when she was young. She started hand quilting with her mother and grandmother, and in sixth grade started quilting with the ladies at church.

She's been a contract instructor at Appletree Quilting Center since the early 2000s when she taught freemotion quilting classes.

Jocelyn Wheeler, a Hickory County MU Extension employee, will direct this workshop on **Satur**day, May 18 from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.

Guild members, Laurie Matthews, Martha Eberhard and Sarah Gist and others have taken this class before and really enjoyed their results. Registration fills up quickly whenever this workshop is offered.

The workshop is limited to 20 people on a first-come, first-served basis. There is a fee of \$30 per person for the workshop. Additional costs will be for the material, based on the size of the barn board you select. The price for a 1x1 ft. plywood board and all other supplies is \$25. The price for a 2x2 ft. barn board is \$50. Both sizes are suitable for indoor and outdoor displays.

Payment in cash or by check is required at time of registration. **Registration is not complete until payment is received.**

Payment for workshop material will be due at the start of class.
