

## Day Chapter Notes from Bettina

#### **Day Chapter Service Project**

Please make multiple 6 (6.5) inch finished 9 Patch blocks. Use your own fabrics, sign your name in the seam allowance of each block. You need nine 2 ½ inch squares per block. Bring the blocks to the meeting, drop them in the basket on the table near the library. A gift certificate (for the quilt shop of your choice) will be given to the person who makes the most blocks by our annual meeting.

#### Sampler Quilt

This is an individual project, completely optional. There will a block size given each month. Make a block that finished size, any block pattern you select. It may be pieced, applique or a combination. There are many reference books in the guild library with block patterns. In May I will provide a layout for your blocks to make a sampler quilt top. Select a theme fabric that sets your palette. You will need approximately 2 yards that will be used in the blocks and possible borders and setting units. The layout will be the same for each person, but the blocks will be of your choice. Each top will be unique. The approximate size is roughly 55-60 inches by 65-70 inches. Block number one is 12 inches finished. The block sizes will always be for the finished size. Next month for block number 2 there will a different block size.

#### **Quilt Show Update**

We're entering the final stretches of quilt show planning - Yay! Many, many thanks to those who have been working so diligently to finish up projects for the Marketplace and/or silent auction, or are putting the finishing touches on the quilts you plan to enter in the show. There is no fee to enter a quilt, nor are quilts juried. All quilts are accepted, except those shown in a BTQG show in the last 5 years (unless it was a Viewer's Choice winner). Quilts 24" or larger require a sleeve on the back. The deadline to enter your quilts is August 15th.

Volunteer sign-ups have begun. Volunteer for a variety of positions throughout the three-day event (set-up, two-day show, and take-down). Volunteer positions are between 1-1/2 (hostess) to 2-1/2 (all other) hour commitments. Please sign up for your preferred job(s) and time slot(s) at any of the remaining chapter meetings. As a reminder, any guild member who works the show over the three days will receive one complimentary ticket (i.e. free admission).

Lastly, in addition to opportunity quilt raffle tickets, we have admission tickets available for presale for \$5. Please contact Martha Eberhard with questions.

### Coming Up In Starlight Piecemakers

I don't know about you, but I love to watch all the new things happening with modern quilt designs. We will have some wonderful modern quilts for you to see in our **September Starlight Piecemakers program**. Trisch Price will be with us from Overland Park, Kansas. Her program will be "Accentuate the Negative." Trisch has been quilting since the 1990s and she now designs and sells her patterns. She has been published in several magazines and has written 2 books—Accentuate the Negative and Tree of Life Quilts.
