If you give X amount in one situation, do you need to give the same amount again in another case? Do we need to respond to every disaster across the globe? Not that we would ever want to do otherwise, but we decided it was best to let individuals decide how and by what amount of money and effort they want to respond. Perhaps members might want to create a group to create quilts, gather clothing, and send money. And it would be perfectly fine to identify themselves as members of BTQG, but not OK to say the donation is from the guild itself.

The BTQG board also decided to refer all requests for quilt appraisals, advice on how to sell quilts for the best profit, how to broker or act as a sales agent and other related questions to the Heartland Quilters' Network. It's a consortium of guilds from Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma and Arkansas. It also includes professionals and supporting sponsors from those five states, plus a few more. Block #1 is 12 inches, Block #2 is 10 inches, Block #3 is 14 inches, Block #4 is (2) 6-inch blocks, and Block #5 is 12 inches.

A Look Ahead for Star light Piecemakers' February 2025 Zoom Meeting Dr. Emelie Gevalt – New York City's American Folk Art Museum



Our Starlight speaker for the February meeting will be Dr. Emelie Gevalt. Join Dr. Gevalt for a behind-the-scenes look at building a new exhibition opening in the fall of 2025, *An Ecology of Quilts*. Dr. Gevalt will discuss the exhibition development process, including the selection of examples from AFAM's over 600 quilts and examination of individual textiles and their stories. Although the interpretation often begins with the craft of the quilter, this project will begin at the true beginning of the making process, illustrating various stages with a dynamic selection of quilts from AFAM's rich holdings. The exhibition will prompt a deeper understanding of the vast complexity of quilting history while engaging visitors with a diverse range of stunning American textiles. It will explore fibers, dyes, fabrics; the networks of trade and transportation required to disseminate these com-

modities; and the ecological and social consequences of these activities. Key topics will include quilters' historical engagement with the natural world through botanical-inspired designs, as well as the sustainability of quilting practice through the use of scraps and other upcycled materials.

Dr. Gevalt is the Curatorial Chair for Collections and Curator of Folk Art at the American Folk Art Museum in New York City. She received her BA in art history and theater studies from Yale University (magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa), her MA from the Winterthur Program in American Material Culture, and her PhD in art history from the University of Delaware. Her two decades of art-world experience include positions at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, and Christie's, New York, where she served as a Vice President in the Estates, Appraisals and Valuations department.

Here's the scoop on Corinne Remeika's secret, of sorts

Corinne Remeika fulfills a semi-secret mission for the Booneslick Trail Quilters' Guild. Since 2014, when she was the coordinator for the Quilt Show's Marketplace, she has been taking leftover merchandise to the Columbia Senior Center's gift shop. The shop sells the items on a consignment basis, returning 75% of the price to BTQG. There was a bit of push-back when she first started, but as she says, "Why not try it?" And she was right. The amount gleaned every month varies widely. When the amount due to the guild has accumulated, the gift shop's manager calls Corinne to come collect a check. For example, on Nov. 12, Corinne collected \$21.75. Late October and early November netted \$18.00, and August and September's combined total was \$84.75. On Nov. 13, Corinne took 20 items including baby blankets left over from the 2024 Marketplace. The manager had requested the blankets. Individual members of the guild can also contact Corinne to take their items to the shop for consignment sale. She asks that guild members go through her so there won't be any confusion in the bookkeeping. I refer to her volunteer work as semi-secret as I had been a guild member for almost three years before I learned about her work when she handed me a check and a report form.


