The next Sampler block size is **two** six-inch blocks. Block #1 is 12 inches, Block #2 is 10 inches, Block #3 is 14 inches, and Block #4 is 2 6-inch blocks.



If you would like to take a packet of blocks home to make a quilt top for our Service Project, talk to Merrill Winfield at any meeting. In the meantime, continue to make 6-inch 9 patch blocks. Just because there is no sew day for service projects does not mean there is no service project.



Booneslick Star Quilt Block Templates



There has been a resurgence in piecing the gorgeous Booneslick Trail Quilt Block. From the result of interest of members, Lora Brinkman and Mindy Smith have worked to get updated acrylic templates made to create a 9 1 /2" unfinished block and sashing from the gorgeous quilt originally made for Shirley Troth. The quilt on the cover of the 1994 book titled *"Quilts from The Booneslick Trail Quilters' Guild"* published by American School of Needlework was designed and pieced by Betting Having. The updated acrylic templates have been tested with machine and handpiecing with accurate results!

The acrylic template sets are custom made by The Patchwork Dog in Fulton, MO. Kadi and her son create a lot of rulers and templates for various quilt shops in the area.

The acrylic template set will include 9 templates for the block and sashing. We cannot split the set for only the block, as it isn't cost-effective to

split it up. Be brave! Try the sashing with any 9 %'' block you make.

Note: This is not a fundraiser for the guild. The template sets are being sold at cost.

- Basic set \$18 for 9 piece set
 - o Templates will be lettered to coordinate with the pattern, include stitching lines, marking holes, and guild name.
 - o Choose from 7 colors: (clear, red, blue, green, orange, yellow, and pink) Glowing Edge* and lines show up best with orange, green, and yellow and least with clear
 - o As a bonus, the pattern for the quilt will be included with each set ordered.

All the features of the basic set PLUS add your name or initials to each template

* If you have used any of the "glowing edge" templates, you will understand how nice these templates are for cutting and marking your pieces. Mindy fell in love with that glowing edge!
