

A Message from Mona —

Thanks again to Marty Webster for her program on her hefty (the holders and folders will agree) collection of lovely quilts. Perhaps a few of us will be inspired to excavate our UFO stash for a quilt to finish.

Our September program is a "Make N Take" session with three project choices, none requiring a machine. Willie will lead a workshop of making cute gnomes from a sock, some flannel or felt, and a few embellishments. You have a choice of an earflap lumberjack cap or peaked (witch's) hat. If you don't want a witch, you could use other fabric or felt to make a team or seasonal gnome. Mona's session will be on making "pillow beads". These tiny gems can be joined with beads into a necklace or bracelet, strung as ornaments, or just tossed in a small basket or bowl, perhaps with some fake pearls or some greenery to decorate a table or dresser. (Photos and minimal supply lists are elsewhere in this issue.) The final project is making quilt labels. Bettina left us with an assortment of fabric labels to be filled in and stitched onto your quilts. I'll provide freezer paper and an iron to stabilize the labels for writing. Bring a permanent pen and the info for the labels. Some have just a small area – room for maker, quilt name, and date. Others are more spacious. This is an opportunity to cross something off your "round

Raeann traveled the United States buying and selling quilts, and she started her own business called "The Country Mouse" to deal in antiques and hand-made textile arts and crafts. Raeann's work appears in The Best of Missouri Hands and she won numerous awards for her original designs and the quilts she created. She also taught textiles and manual arts for the Vocational Technical School's adult education program in Macon, Missouri, for many years. She was a dealer at Carousel Antiques in Macon, Missouri, the Ice Chalet Antique Mall and also The Marketplace in Columbia, Missouri, for decades.

She enjoyed her membership in the Booneslick Trail Quilter's Guild of Columbia, Missouri, and her quilting circle at the First Christian Church in Macon, Missouri, and loved the friends she made there. Her full obituary appeared in the <u>Columbia Daily Tribune</u> on Saturday, August 16, 2025. Our warmest thoughts go to her family and friends.

Make N Take Supply Lists

For the Gnomes

Since we will be using glue guns or fabric glue, *please bring something to protect your workspace*. We don't want to get glue on the church's tables. An old plastic tablecloth works well, as does a piece of freezer paper.

- 1. A sock for each gnome. You can purchase two pairs for \$1.25 at Dollar Tree or bring one from your sock drawer.
- 2. A marker to trace the pattern. A chalk pencil or something that will show up on the black felt, if making the witch gnome.
- 3. Pins, needle and thread, scissors, clips help if you are making the mud flap hat gnome.
- 4. Rice to stuff and weight the sock body. Each gnome takes about one cup.
- 5. If you are making the witch gnome, you will need a felt square for the hat. I purchased a black one at Hobby Lobby for 25 cents. They have others with sparkles for 99 cents.
- 7. A glue gun or fabric glue. (Several will be available, if you don't have one.)
- 8. Any embellishments you want for your gnome. You will probably want ribbon or netting for the witch hat.

Supplies Provided:

- 1. Noses for your gnome. Green paint, if you want a green nose.
- 2. Small black beads for a wart on the witch's nose.
- 3. The patterns for the gnome hats.
- 4. Sherpa and two colors of plaid flannel (used for the ear flap hat).
- 5. Faux fur for the beard. I have a lot of gray but not much white.
- 6. Spiders for the witch if you want.
- 7. Orange yarn for the witch braids.
- 8. Poly-fil stuffing to finish filling after the rice.

For the Beads

- Fabric scraps mini charms or other fabric cut 2.5" or 3" square, pressed
- Thread to blend with fabric
- Clover clips (not essential, but very helpful), needle, snips, or small scissors
- If you want some sparkle, metallic thread for simple embroidery

It is such a pleasure to bring Missie Carpenter to you this year as our special speaker. Missie is an excellent speaker and teacher. I have used her technique and products for several years and love the ease of stitching that her method provides. Missie's method of appliqué preparation is what I use for turned edge machine applique on my art quilts. Her technique makes the layout and stitching so much easier and faster. And it is also wonderful to use if you enjoy English paper piecing. Here is a link to her website (https://traditionalprimitives.com) and some videos about her method and products.

You will see in her attached bio that she has been published in several popular quilting magazines, and she has taught for several years at The Academy of Applique in historic Williamsburg. And Missie just recently announced that next spring she will be teaching at the 2026 Empty Spools Seminars in Asilomar, California. I'm so excited for her! Folk Art Whimsey Applique Block Workshop

The Folk Art Whimsey workshop is for both beginners and advanced stitchers. It will focus on Missie's method of prepared edge applique shapes, placement and fast sewing by hand or machine. She will teach you that, with her method, you can easily stitch points, arcs and circles using 1/8th seams. Registration for both days is \$75. A workshop supply list will be sent to you after your registration is received. (A \$24 Lab Kit is required; you will purchase that from Missie during the class. No tracing will be involved because the Lab Kit contains the pattern, needles, and preprinted templates on doubled Traditional Primitives Freezer Paper ready to cut.)


